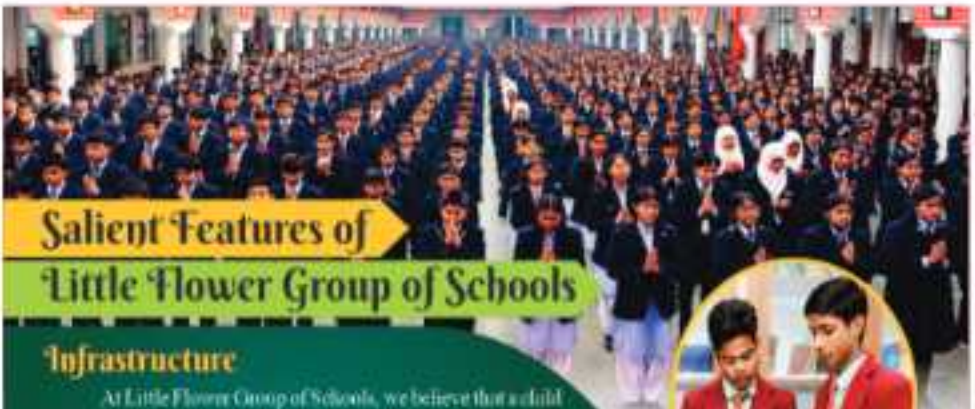

The Elite Scholar Conduct & Protocol Handbook

Chapter I: The Appearance & Punctuality Standard:

• The Uniform is a Brand:

The prescribed school uniform is the official, non-negotiable branding of our institution. It must be worn with impeccable pride and cleanliness at all times, reflecting the high standards of our community.

- **Immaculate Presentation:** Students are expected to arrive at school looking impeccably groomed, clean, neat, and highly presentable.
- **Zero-Tolerance for Tardy Arrivals:** Punctuality is the first lesson in executive discipline. Students must be present before the first bell. Habitual tardiness will be treated as a serious breach of protocol and addressed swiftly.
- **The Punctual Departure Protocol:** When leaving the campus, scholars must follow a structured and disciplined exit strategy, ensuring a smooth and orderly transition.

Chapter II: The Conduct & Integrity Mandate:

- **The Code of Respect:** Students must treat all staff members—including teachers, management, and support personnel—with unwavering respect, courtesy, and professional deference.
- **The Power of Silence:** Complete silence and focus are required during all prayer sessions, assemblies, and high-level school gatherings.
- **Ethical Resource Management:** The use of unfair means, cheating, or any form of academic or social fraud is an automatic and irreversible act of gross misconduct, resulting in immediate and decisive action.
- **The Non-Invasion Clause:** Scholars are strictly prohibited from entering the Principal's, Manager's, or Headmaster's chambers without explicit, prior permission. These are zones of high-level administrative focus.
- **Prohibition of Contraband:** The possession of dangerous materials, including explosives, weapons, or any item that poses a security risk, is a High-Risk Violation that will lead to instant and permanent dismissal.
- **Zero-Tolerance for Vandalism:** Causing damage to school property is an act of criminal destruction of valuable assets and will not be tolerated.

Chapter III: Security & Administrative Directives:

- **The School-Only Policy:** Scholars must never leave the campus during the designated school hours without the explicit, documented approval of the Principal, granted only in cases of high urgency.
- **The Security of Assets:** Students are responsible for the personal security of their books, bags, and high-value personal belongings. The school is not liable for the loss or damage of any such assets.
- **The Communication Channel:** All grievances, requests, or communications with the school administration must be formally documented in the official Student's Diary, which serves as the primary and auditable channel.

Fees Structure & Guidelines

1. Tuition fees are payable for all twelve months of the academic year. Failure to deposit fees for two consecutive months will result in the child's name being struck off the school register. A late fine of ₹300 per month will be applicable.
2. Students will not be permitted to appear for any examination unless all dues have been cleared in full.
3. For the convenience of parents and to avoid last-minute inconvenience, fees may be paid yearly, half-yearly, or quarterly.



Expected from LFCS / LFIS Students

1. Students should maintain good health and personal hygiene.
2. They must respect their elders, teachers, staff, and peers.
3. Students should be friendly, polite, and cooperative both inside and outside the school.
4. They must be punctual and attend school regularly.
5. Students should come to school in proper uniform and maintain a neat appearance.
6. They should always speak the truth and act honestly.
7. Students must be ready to help their parents, teachers, and classmates.
8. They should take proper care of school property and immediately report any damage.
9. Students must respect the rights, freedom, and dignity of others.
10. They should avoid idle talk, bullying, abusive language, and misbehavior.
11. Students are expected to use their time wisely and remain focused on their studies.
12. They should interact in English within the school premises (as per school rules).
